2	Learning outcomes / Skills With their master's thesis, students should demonstrate that they are able to work independently on a problem from the relevant subject area, at an academic level, within the allotted time. The colloquium supplements the master's thesis. It serves to determine whether the candidate is able to orally present the results of the master's thesis, independently represent these results and assess their significance as well as putting them in interdisciplinary context and making links with other fields.

5	Participation requirements Students who have achieved at least 78 ECTS credits in the first three study semesters are accepted for the master's thesis in the fourth semester. Students who intend to complete their foreign study semester in the fourth semester can also be accepted for the master's thesis in the third semester, as long as they have achieved 60 ECTS credits in the first year of study.
